Fact Sheet on HR. 1786/S.928 Statistics that show the Size and Scope of the 9/11 Health Crisis facing 9/11 Responders, Survivors and their Families

Below is information on the size and extent of the Health Crisis facing injured and ill 9/11 Responders and Survivors, including residents, student, area workers.

- There are <u>72,297 Responders and Survivors</u> who are living in <u>every State</u> and from <u>433</u> of 435 Congressional Districts.
- There are <u>8,485 participating in the National Program</u> which provides medical treatment and monitoring for 9/11 Responders who live outside the New York Metropolitan Area, including responders to the Pentagon and the Shanksville crash site.
- There are over <u>63,000 9/11 Responders</u> receiving medical monitoring to safeguard against emerging injuries.
- There are <u>8,942</u> injured 9/11 Survivors receiving medical treatment for their injuries from the World Trade Center Health Program.
- There are over 33,000 Responders and Survivors have at least one 9/11 condition and over two thirds have more than one condition and a large number of those suffer from multiple injuries and illnesses.
- Over 22,000 9/11 Responders and Survivors sought treatment last year, for their 9/11 injury from the World Trade Center Health Program.
- Over 2,000 active duty Fire Department personnel (Fire Fighters and EMS) and over 550 NYC Police Department personal have had to retire due to disabling 9/11 injuries.
- More than 4,166 Responders and Survivors have been certified to have a 9/11 related cancer, of which over 1,100 are New York City Fire Fighters and EMS personnel.
- Over <u>94 New York Police Department officers</u> and over 110 Firefighters have reportedly died of their 9/11 injuries since 9/11 and more are expected in the coming years.
- To date, the September 11 Victim Compensation Fund has received 20, 622 eligibility claims. Of those claims submitted it has found 12,150 eligible, has denied eligibility on 1,668 claims
- The VCF has made <u>6,285</u> compensation determinations for injured and ill responders and survivors or their families totaling over \$1.44 Billion.
